


'No one is useless in this world who lightens the burdens of another,' wrote Charles Dickens in 1865's *Doctor Marigold's Prescriptions*. And while his words may be referring to the adventures of Victorian life, they are equally relevant today.

Whether you're enjoying a peaceful, alfresco breakfast on the beautiful ground-floor courtyard terrace, or an expertly crafted cocktail and pizza at the lively bar, you'll find decorative nods to the historical charm of the area. Think jauntily monocled foxes, dark wood shelves stacked with vintage tomes, burnished brass and deep-hued tweeds that bring an old-world ambience everywhere you turn.

Signs of the area's Victorian bookbinding heritage can also be found in the rooms where you'll discover a quirky selection of quills, inkwells and marbled endpapers hung over the bed. As the first Ruby Hotel to offer the option of windowless rooms, Stella has a variety of room sizes to accommodate every traveller. Nest
